Travel + Leisure's World's Best Cruise Line is visiting Australia for the first time this month Immersive onshore experiences bring the true flavour of Australia to guests

Sydney, 7 February 2018 – *Viking Sun*, the newest addition to the Viking Ocean Cruises fleet, will be visiting Australian shores for the first time this month as part of its world cruise which commenced in Miami on 15 December.

Visiting 65 ports and 35 countries over 141 days travelling from Miami to London, *Viking Sun's* voyage marks the first ever World Cruise for Viking, and its first foray into Australia and New Zealand.

CEO of the Australian Cruise Association, Jill Abel, said,

"Viking is the embodiment of the future of cruising in Australia. Their focus on providing an extensive array of interesting destination activities echoes our research with cruise passengers who tell us they are now selecting their cruise lines to enjoy the onshore offerings as well as the onboard experience.

With many exciting experiences on offer showcasing the history, natural beauty and iconic wildlife in Australia, communities are welcoming the economic impact made by ships like the Viking Sun," said Ms Abel.

Melbourne will be the ship's first Australian port of call on Thursday 8 February 2018, followed by Sydney, Brisbane, The Whitsunday Islands, Cairns, The Great Barrier Reef, Thursday Island and Darwin, then onto Indonesia on its journey northwards towards London.

Viking Sun will offer its 930 guests the opportunity to experience a wide variety of immersive onshore excursions to truly explore the food, culture, people and customs of Australia.

44 tours will be offered across the seven ports, with guests able to uncover the best Australia has to offer; from Melbourne's café culture and vibrant laneways, to climbing the iconic Sydney Harbour bridge, or venturing deep into Darwin's crocodile country. Viking Cruises has ensured the Australian experience for its guests will be authentic, in-depth and memorable.

With no casinos, kids, umbrella drinks or buffet meals, guests can focus on refreshing their historical and cultural knowledge on board with a resident historian before each port of call, allowing for a more enriched experience than cruising might usually permit..

Viking will start home-porting from Australia in December 2018, spending three months of the year cruising between Sydney and Auckland, offering Australians the chance to experience Viking right from their doorstep.
