Arriving by cruise ship in Australia's first city is always special, with the scenery evolving from the ancient sandstone cliffs of Sydney Heads and pristine national park bushland just inside the harbour, to the iconic Opera House, Harbour Bridge and ever changing city skyline that reveal themselves as you round Bradley's Head.

And we have the cruise facilities to match. The White Bay Cruise Terminal has won multiple state, national and overseas awards for innovative design, and now the iconic Overseas Passenger Terminal (OPT) at Circular Quay has been upgraded to match. Following its multi-million dollar investment, the OPT ensures a comfortable one day turnaround for the largest of ships and provides the unique operational ability to service two cruise ships at berth at one time.

Whether it be the OPT, right on the city's door step, or White Bay just west of the Harbour Bridge, both facilities offer easy access to downtown hotels, shopping, restaurants and tourist attractions as well as Sydney's domestic and international airports that are just a short journey away by car, taxi, shuttle bus or train.

Newcastle

The Port of Eden is the world's third deepest natural harbour and provides safe anchorage for large cruise ships. It offers a unique snapshot of whaling history and is a sanctuary for whales during their migratory journeys.

The Wharf is within walking distance of the town centre where there are cafes to enjoy seafood from our pristine waterways. The new wharf, allowing direct docking of vessels up to 325m, has been a game changer for Eden.

An exciting range of tour options include nature and marine adventures, food and wine experiences, cultural, history and heritage experiences and outdoor and adventure tours. Some options include oyster farm tour and tasting, wildlife refuge, whale museum, exploring the local Sapphire Coast villages, marine research centre, local markets, food and wine events, guided kayaking and water sports, and the coastal art trail.

Wollongong

Wollongong is a beautiful seaside city nestled between the dramatic Illawarra escarpment and the Tasman Sea, located only an hour's drive south of Sydney.

The buzzing city centre offers shopping, art galleries, cafés, restaurants boasting fresh seafood and a lively bar scene. This is complemented by the abundance of natural beauty on offer with 17 stunning beaches, historic harbours and coastal rainforests – making it the perfect spot for outdoor adventure and activities.

Visitors can explore the world's 2nd oldest National Park, or the 30 million-year-old Illawarra escarpment which offers a number of hiking trails and stunning scenic lookouts. Or take any number of exciting tour options including a visit to the renowned Sea Cliff Bridge or Australia's highest altitude beach skydive.







Port Kembla

The port of Port Kembla is just five minutes' drive on the shuttle buses from Wollongong's CBD and beaches. The port is a key gateway supporting New South Wales' motor vehicle, mining, agricultural, manufacturing and construction industries.

The port operates across two precincts, the Inner Harbour and the Outer Harbour.

The port has a deep water shipping channel that can accommodate vessels with ship length (LOA) of 300m and has capacity for capesize vessels (at nominated berths). A short shipping channel minimises vessel transit time and contributes to port efficiency.

Ownership of the port rail network by NSW Ports provides flexibility in port operations.

The port operates 24 hours per day, seven days a week (24/7).

South Australia

Adelaide

Adelaide is the capital of South Australia, a beautiful city nestled between the sea and the hills. It is a vibrant and accessible city that relishes good living, fine food, wine and the arts in beautiful surroundings - more than a million people call it home.

Classic Australian architecture and cultural attractions are within easy walking distance of Rundle Mall, the major shopping precinct. The Adelaide Hills, Barossa Valley and Fleurieu Peninsula (McLaren Vale) are within easy reach of the port for shore excursions.

The Port Adelaide Passenger Terminal is 23 km from the Adelaide city centre. Trains to the city run from the railway station just 150 metres from the terminal door and the journey takes 35 minutes.

Kangaroo Island

Kangaroo Island boasts unspoilt white beaches, gourmet food and wines and a real holiday spirit.

Wildlife surrounds Kangaroo Island. The ocean is teeming with fish, sea lions and little penguin colonies. Stand on the shore in the cooler months and watch migrating southern right whales and their calves. This place is like a zoo without fences, with rare bird life, tammar wallabies, shortbeaked echidnas and plenty of kangaroos and koalas.

Boasting wildlife, wildlife and more wildlife, the best way to truly appreciate Kangaroo Island's animal residents is on a tour. In addition, you'll see a spectacular and diverse coastline including the tallest coastal cliffs in South Australia and gorgeous hidden coves.

Port Lincoln

The seafood capital of Australia, Port Lincoln is a town of 15,000 people on the southern tip of the Eyre Peninsula in South Australia. A tantalising smorgasbord from shellfish to finfish, all gathered from the pristine waters surrounding Eyre Peninsula, is guaranteed to please any seafood connoisseur. Matched with regional wine, it's pure indulgence.

Outdoor adventurers visit for big game fishing and four wheel driving (4WD) through wild, untamed landscapes. Wildlife adventurers visit for unrivalled aquatic experiences like shark cage diving and swimming with sea lions, dolphins or massive bluefin tuna. Or for the slightly less adventurous, kayaking and stand up paddleboarding is on offer.

Robe

Robe is located on the Limestone Coast, with a proud tradition in shipping, fishing and as a gateway for immigrants for the Victorian goldrush. As well as the beautiful beachside town, it's a great hub to reach the UNESCO World Heritage listed Naracoorte Caves with their megafauna fossils that are around half a million years old.

Also in easy day touring reach is the home of Australia's first Saint, Mary MacKillop, whose legacy lives on in the town of Penola, and the nearby Coonawarra wine region which has put the Limestone Coast on the international wine map for its premium reds, with the first vines planted on the unique terra rossa soils in 1891.

Victor Harbor

Victor Harbor has been a favourite holiday destination for South Australian families since the late 1800s. The town overlooks beautiful Encounter Bay with a coastline featuring the huge rock outcrop of The Bluff and the very popular Granite Island.

Encounter Bay is blessed with a classic Mediterranean climate that makes Victor Harbor a great destination all year round. Long expanses of white sand beaches offer beautiful vistas and water activities, from swimming to stand up paddle boarding. Granite Island is made special by having the world's only daily Horse Drawn Tram service that began operating on the causeway in 1886.

The township is right at the landside of the causeway, offering visitors all amenities, cafes, shops, a Visitor Information Centre and a Meet and Greet service. The famous McLaren Vale wine region is only a 30 minute drive away from Victor Harbor, where visitors can taste world class wines and experience the unique d'Arenberg Cube.





Wallaroo

Wallaroo, located on the Yorke Peninsula, is South Australia's newest cruise destination. Yorke Peninsula is South Australia's coastal paradise, with stunning beaches, jagged shorelines and friendly coastal towns. With around 100 kilometres of coastline, there is no shortage of things to see and do on Yorke Peninsula. Inland, you can find historic mining villages and spectacular national parks. It's the perfect location for sun, sand and seafood.

Located at the southern tip of the Yorke Peninsula, Innes National Park is a natural playground, brimming with beautiful beaches, outstanding surf and dramatic cliffs. With majestic headlands, sweeping beaches and beautiful bays, Innes National Park is a wilderness haven with views that will leave you breathless.

The Yorke Peninsula is rich in natural heritage, especially from the copper mining times in the mid-19th century. The history is evident in the town of Wallaroo, as well as Moonta and Kadina and is known to locals as the Copper Coast. A legacy of the Cornish Miners, you can find more Cornish Pasties per square kilometre in each town (especially Moonta) than anywhere else in South Australia.




