Western Australian Tourism Minister to open 2025 Australian Cruise Association Conference

New program updates, with only 1 week to go!

The Australian Cruise Association (ACA) today confirmed that the Hon. Reece Whitby MLA, Western Australia's Minister for Tourism and the Great Southern, will officially open the 2025 ACA Conference in Fremantle, Western Australia, from 3–5 September.

Minister Whitby will address delegates at the Welcome Function, to be held at the iconic Gage Roads Freo on Wednesday 3 September. In a fitting and spectacular moment, Scenic's ultra-luxury discovery yacht *Scenic Eclipse II* will pass by the venue as the sun sets on Fremantle Harbour, marking its inaugural visit to the port.

"This is a significant moment for ACA and for Fremantle," said Jill Abel, CEO of the Australian Cruise Association. "Minister Whitby's presence, along with *Scenic Eclipse II* sailing past the function, sets the tone for a conference focused on innovation, regional opportunity, and industry collaboration."

Minister Whitby added, "It's a privilege to open the 2025 Australian Cruise Association Conference here in Fremantle.

"WA's cruise industry generated \$385 million in economic impact in 2023-24 and supported more than 1,200 local jobs, making it a vital contributor to Western Australia's tourism sector.

"I look forward to this event building on that success, strengthening industry partnerships, and highlighting the vital role cruise plays in driving regional tourism." Jenny Archibald, Deputy Mayor of Fremantle, will also be in attendance at the Welcome Function, alongside a host of cruise and tourism sector dignitaries.

Adding to the local flavour of the event, the Mayor of Fremantle, Hannah Fitzhardinge, will join delegates at the Friday morning conference breakfast. Guests will hear from
